Know more about the use of for and since.

The Present Perfect Continuous tense is often used – generally with *for* or *since* - to describe how long something has been happening up to now.

For example:

Q: How long have you been studying English? **A:** I've been studying English for four years.

Note - You can just say "For four years."

Q: How long have you been living in Germany? **A:** I've been living here since 1998.

Note - You can just say "Since 1998".

Note - *For* is always used with a *length* of time and *since* with a *point* in time.
